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Dear Future AP Precalculus Student,

As you begin AP Precalculus, there are certain prerequisite skills that must be mastered and will be essential to your success. AP Precalculus is fast paced and rigorous; students can quickly fall behind and become frustrated when old skills continually impede the understanding of new skills. This summer assignment will give you a refresher on these essential prerequisite topics.
